Background

- Storm water and runoff treated as a pollutant
- January 2014 California Water Action Plan
- 2014 Storm Water Strategic Initiative

Senate Bill 985

- Storm water and dry weather runoff as a resource
- Emphasizes multi-benefit storm water projects
- Emphasizes use of publicly owned lands
- Requires a Storm Water Resource Plan for funding
- State Water Board will provide guidance for Plan preparation

Storm Water Resource Plan Guidelines (Guidelines)

Required to identify:

- Entities to consult in Plan preparation
- Methods to identify and prioritize projects in Plans
- Scale of watershed Plan
- Other guidance as needed

(WC § 10565)



EWMP: Upper LA River







Figure 1-2. Upper Los Angeles River EWMP Area and Jurisdictions that Comprise the ULAR EWMP Group



2014: Proposition 1 - The Water Bond (AB 1471)





REGIONAL WATER RELIABILITY: \$810 MILLION

Water conservation, stormwater capture and other programs that increase local and regional water supplies.



Regional Water Reliability \$810 million

Multi-Benefit Stormwater Management Projects \$200 million

Storm Water Grant Program

- Division of Financial Assistance (DFA)
- \$200 million for grants for multi-benefit storm water management projects
- Eligible projects may include: green infrastructure, rainwater and storm water capture projects, and storm water treatment facilities


